

## School Dental Screening

During the year, the dental team from the **School Dental Mobile** will be visiting the school to carry out dental screening of children enrolled with the School Dental Service.

This is a simple procedure where disposable pop sticks are used to retract the cheeks to allow the Dental Officer to see how the teeth have developed. As a result of this, the Dental Officer may request to speak to the parents or guardians of some children. In most cases, this will be to discuss orthodontic considerations.

Children whose parents have not given consent for treatment with the School Dental Service will not be examined.


